

Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time October 7, 2007

From the Desk of the Parochial Vicar,

The Mass in honor of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated each year on Oct. 7. This year is an exception because it falls on a Sunday. Rarely is Sunday displaced by a saint's feast, in order to give the best day to the best saint: Jesus. Only the most important feasts can coincide with a Sunday Mass, as on June 24 of this year, when we celebrated the Solemnity of the Nativity of John the Baptist. This will occur for any given solemnity, on average, every seven years since there are seven days in the week. Though we certainly have Marian solemnities in our calendar, Our Lady of the Rosary is a lesser celebration.

Even though our Lord's feast trumped our Lady's today, he won't be offended if you take time to honor his mother. Pray the rosary today in observance of Our Lady of the Rosary. According to Pope Paul VI, "Your Rosary is like a ladder that you climb step by step, drawing you close to our Lady, which means finding Christ. It is a devotion which leads us to Christ through Mary" (*Marialis Cultus*). Consider making your intention for today's rosary the continuation of Christianity in the West. Pope Pius V instituted this day in the liturgical calendar because he attributed to praying of the rosary the success of the Christians at the 1571 battle of Lepanto, Greece. There the Christian forces prevented the Turks from occupying Europe. There's nothing like a fleet of warships in your waters to motivate prayer! Hopefully it will take less to convince us to pray the rosary.
